# Code Enforcement and You: The Department at a Glance

## Mission

The Code Enforcement Department managed by Code Services Inc. continues to apply communi-ty-oriented enforcement programs. We deliver a comprehensive code enforcement program that incorporates the most current enforcement methods and techniques while maintaining a community service-oriented approach in a reactive manner as instructed by Town Council.
In the long-term this is a more effective approach that focuses on gaining voluntary compliance. This does not mean that our citizens are immune from notices of violations and civil penalties, but it means that warnings and fines are merely tools or a means to obtain compliance with the Town of Southwest Ranches codes.
Our goal is to educate and assist our present and future residents through the effective and fair application of our Town codes and ordinances. We are committed to the delivery of quality service to our community. Our mission statement is as follows:
"The Code Enforcement Department is dedicated to the education and assistance of our citizens through the effective application of modern Code Enforcement programs; applied to protect the community's health, safety and welfare so that, in cooperation, we may improve the quality of life within our Town."

## What is Code Enforcement?

This is an advanced professional public service work involving the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the community through the implementation, application, and administration of effective investigation and enforcement of a variety of Town of Southwest Ranches' code regulations and ordinances. We focus on the effective application of current code enforcement methodologies including the effective delivery of services to the public and the development of appropriate strategies to resolve related community issues. Among the things that we do include:

- Enforcement of all applicable Town of South-
west Ranches Ordinances and Broward County Codes as adopted and/or amended.
- Recommendation and drafting of legislation designed to enhance service delivery.
- Issuance of Civil Violation Notices and collection of associated penalties.
- Lien Search Requests.

The Code Enforcement Department routinely interacts with all other Town Departments as we administer our enforcement methods in dealing with: zoning issues, building code issues, public safety and nuisance's issues, minimum housing, property maintenance issues and a host of other enforcement disciplines and administrative issues.
There are several methods used to identify and enforce against code violations. The Town of Southwest Ranches uses a community-oriented method, complaint generated and non pro-active in nature, that it is focused on gaining compliance.

## Florida Statute 162 (overview)

The Code Enforcement Department follows Florida Statute 162. This Statute is entitled "County or Municipal Code Enforcement" and authorizes the creation of local administrative boards with the authority to impose administrative fines and other non-criminal penalties to provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive method of enforcing any codes and ordinances in force in counties and municipalities. It is the intent of the legislature to promote, protect and im-
prove the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of counties and municipalities through the creation and implementation of these local boards.

The promulgation of State Statute 162 was driven by the need for home rule in conjunction with the need to alleviate the burden placed on the local court system due to the administration of these primarily civil infractions. The intent of the legislature was to "decriminalize" these infractions and to compel and hold local authorities accountable for the fair and equitable resolution of code violations. Therefore, the purpose of any code enforcement agency should be to provide non-judicial solutions for their citizens for any violations of the local code.

## Department Personnel

The Department has a Code Enforcement Director with over 22 years of Code Enforcement and Community Development combined experience, an Assistant Code Enforcement Director, one Code Enforcement Officer, and an Administrative Coordinator. We have been certified by the Florida Association of Code Enforcement Officers and are required to maintain these credentials via continued education classes as well as annual code enforcement conferences. Both the Director and the Assistant Director have Level III Certification by the Florida Association of Code Enforcement Officers. We have provided a picture within the article of our personnel so that you become familiar with us.

## PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FILING DATES anNounced for town of southwest ranches, SOUTHWEST RANCHES

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2018 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

Thursday, December 6th, 2018 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM
Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card, AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2018 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2018, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2018, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2017 not exceeding $\$ 29,454$. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2017 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2017 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).
**DEADLINE for any 2018 EXEMPTIONS is September 18TH, 2018*

## Scammers Demand Gift Cards:

Gift cards are a great way to give a gift. But did you know they are also a scammer's favorite way to steal money? According to the Federal Trade Commission's (FTC) new Data Spotlight, more scammers are demanding payment with a gift card than ever before - a whopping 270 percent increase since 2015.
Gift cards are for gifts, not for payments. If someone calls with urgent news or a convincing story and then pressures you to pay them by buying a gift card, like an iTunes or Google Play card, and then giving them the codes on the back of the card - stop. It is a scam. Gift cards are the number one payment method that imposters demand. They might pose as IRS officials and say you are in trouble for not paying taxes; or a family member with an emergency; or a public utility company threatening to shut off your water; or even a service member selling something before deployment. Or they might call with great news - you have won a contest or a prize! But to get it, you need to pay fees with a gift card. Scammers will say anything to get your money. And they know how to play into your fears, hopes or sympathies. They like gift cards because, once they have got the code on the back, the money is gone and almost impossible to trace. But knowing how these scams work can help you avoid them, and you can help even more by passing on the information to people you know. If you
paid a scammer with a gift card, report it as soon as possible. Call the card company and tell them the gift card was used in a scam. Here is contact information for some of the gift card companies that scammers use most often. Then, tell the FTC about it - or any other scam - at ftc.gov/complaint. Your reports may help law enforcement agencies launch investigations that could stop imposters and other fraudsters in their tracks.
