

Pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers are commonly used in agricultural areas. However, we should take care to when using them as they can have adverse consequences. Pesticides and herbicides are typically used in the maintenance of lawns and gardens. Improper use can hurt beneficial insects, animals, as well as the applicant. Additionally, overuse of pesticides and herbicides can cause pests and unwanted vegetation to become resistant against it. Caution must be taken as pesticides and herbicides can seep through soil and contaminate the groundwater.

Fertilizers are often rich with nitrogen and phosphorus, ingredients that are beneficial for plant growth. However, if care is not taken fertilizers can run off into adjacent water bodies such as canals and lakes. This can harm water bodies by altering their composition and causing a rapid growth of algae. The increased algae will in turn reduce oxygen levels which negatively affects fish and other aquatic organisms. In addition to this, the nitrogen in fertilizer can also contaminate groundwater if it seeps through. Pesticides herbicides, and fertilizers should always be used as per their instruction label.

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





In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a predrafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

Fill for horse stalls does not require a fill permit. In addition, a permit may not be required if a small amount of sand is required to replenish a horse arena. However the Town recommends that a property owner or lease contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.

Frog Fruit: Native Ground Cover

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF FROG FRUIT?



1. IT GROWS QUICKLY

If you are looking for a ground cover that grows quickly, this is the one for you. You can always trim it back. It is easy to remove because it doesn't put out long roots. A ground cover like this does a great job in crowding out weeds so you have to weed less. Many people even use frog fruit as a lawn alternative. It grows well in part sun to full sun conditions. Imagine replacing even a portion of your lawn with this pretty flowering plant. Rather than being an ecological dead zone like most nonnative turf, it will bring your yard alive with pollinators.

2. IT IS VERY LOW MAINTENANCE

While frog fruit blooms best in full sun, it can handle some shade too. It can handle some walking on without being damaged. It can also handle very dry, hot conditions.



3. IT HAS A LONG BLOOM PERIOD

The white blooms appear in April and last all the way until October. It is just as visually interesting as other flowering perennials. In addition to a ground cover, it can be used as a trailing flower for pots.



Frog fruit in bloom attracts pollinators of all types from bees to wasps, to butterflies...it is alive with action. It is a fun plant for children and adults to observe alike. It would be a great addition to add to a pollinator garden.

5. IT IS A HOST PLANT FOR SEVERAL BUTTERFLY SPECIES

When looking for new plants for your yard, prioritize host plants. Those plants that are used by butterflies and moths to lay their eggs and feed their caterpillars. This plant checks the box as a host plant for three different butterfly species: Phaon crescent, White peacock, Common buckeye.

FROG FRUIT FLOWER

4. IT IS LOVED BY POLLINATORS

The frog fruit flower is a dainty white flower that packs a big punch when it comes to attracting pollinators! The white flower is actually several tiny flowers in one, all perched on a brown cone. The flowers are at the end of a skinny stem that sticks out from the ground cover.





HOW TO GROW FROG FRUIT

There is not much involved in growing frog fruit. Water it regularly until it is established, but after that it is very easy going. It can be trimmed back in the winter if it gets too dense or tangled. Frogfruit goes dormant in the winter but can be semi-evergreen in warmer climates.

HOW TO TRANSPLANT FROG FRUIT

To transplant or propagate frog fruit, you can just take one of its runners with roots. Clip it from the main plant and carefully replant in a new area. Take some of the runners from landscaping and transplant them to between steppingstones leading to your wildflower garden.

2025 Homestead Exemption

All qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums, co-op apartments, and certain mobile home lots. To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on January 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on January 1. If you acquired the property as your permanent residence in 2024 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2025 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2025 to file your exemption application. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/HomesteadExemption

The timely deadline to file for all 2025 exemptions is March 3, 2025. You must make the property your permanent residence by January 1, 2025 to qualify; however, you have until March 3 to timely file your application with the our office. The late filing deadline for all 2025 exemptions is September 17, 2025.

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, yourdentaily alosed need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead ExemptioTowerHawalosed card next month to keep for your records. • Rolling Oaks Civic Association Meeting
